

Health and Social Care: KS4

Students will follow an assessment plan and complete three components of work throughout KS4. They will also sit an external exam during Year 11.

At the end of Component 1, students will sit an internal PSA where they will need to consolidate all knowledge to create a written assignment, this will also apply to Component 2 which will be carried out across both years. Component 3, an external exam, will be sat in the summer series of Year 11.

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This external component builds on knowledge and understanding acquired and developed in Components 1 and 2, and includes synoptic assessment. Learners will apply their knowledge and understanding of human lifespan development and life events, sources and types of support, health and social care services, the skills, attributes and values that contribute to care and the barriers and personal obstacles to accessing services. An exam worth 60 marks will be completed under supervised conditions. The supervised assessment period is 2 hours and should be arranged in the period timetabled by Pearson. The assessment availability is January/February and May/June. First assessment is January/February 2024.
