English	<p>https://www.shakespeare.org.uk/ - create a fact file of all the information you can find on the attached website for William Shakespeare</p> <p>https://www.shakespeare.org.uk/explore-shakespeare/shakespedia/shakespeares-plays/romeo-and-juliet/ - create a storyboard of all the key events of the play 'Romeo and Juliet'.</p> <p>Make a list of all the vocabulary we have studied in year 7 and suggest links to 'Romeo and Juliet' to use when you start your studies.</p>
Maths	<p>https://sparxmaths.uk/student - log into sparx. Go to independent learning and type in the codes listed on the sheet (inside the Maths folder). All of the codes are separated into the half term topics of the year that you will be completing next year. This is a perfect way to make a head start on your learning for Maths!</p> <p>Additionally you could access the summer booklet in the Maths folder and work through the activities.</p>
Science	<p>Access the 'Getting ready for Year 8 Science' pdf. Read the key knowledge information and then attempt the questions.</p>
MFL	<p>French/Spanish: Learn/ revise as many of the Universals as you can – use 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' self-quizzing method on the Powerpoint. The resources are in the MFL folder.</p>
History	<p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zyqb9ty/articles/z8jcdnb - create a fact file on the Mughal empire by the using the attached link to research and develop your background knowledge. This topic will mark the beginning of year 8. Once you have completed this you can complete the quiz at the bottom of the link.</p>

	<p>https://byjus.com/govt-exams/list-mughal-emperors/ - create a timeline that plots each of the Mughal emperors and some of the key events that links to each king for example, Shan Jahan (Mughal King Number Five) built the Taj Mahal in 1632.</p>
Geography	<p>Population - KS3 Geography - BBC Bitesize - BBC Bitesize Go to the link and read the information about population. Complete the quiz.</p> <p>Use the knowledge organiser to create a poster to help you get ready for Year 8 geography!</p>
Computing	Complete the scratch programming project using the resource in the computing folder.
PE	Use the information on the knowledge organisers to complete the 'what have you understood' slide and the stretch and challenge task.
RE	Read through the knowledge organiser and create your own preparation notes for the Y8 topics.
Music	Access the Summer work Y7 document and complete the tasks.
Art	Access the Art Summer activities PowerPoint and work through the suggested activities.
Literacy and Reading	Take advantage of some of our reading recommendations or get involved in the summer reading challenge. Access both of these documents in the Literacy and Reading activities folder.
